Project Overview

Tell us a little about your project. What are the main objectives of the project, and who will benefit from it?

This project will provide hope to children with heart disease in Haiti. Lifesaving heart surgeries will be provided to 36 Haitian children during 3 VTT Medical Training Missions to St. Damien Hospital. An additional 300 children will be evaluated, diagnosed and prioritized for treatment on the National Cardiac Waiting List during these VTT missions. Additionally, children treated previously will be provided follow up care. This global grant will also provide funding to purchase essential probes/transducers which are necessary to view images of the heart. This essential equipment will allow for cardiologists to accurately diagnose the children based on high quality imaging. Of equal if not more importance, these transducers will allow the surgical teams to have a clear view of the heart defect both pre and post operatively resulting in improved surgical outcomes as well as the ability to treat children with slightly more complex heart defects where clear and concise imaging is essential.

Why did you choose to partner with this organization and what will its role be?

Gift of Life International (GOLI) has been working in Haiti since 2011 in an effort to provide hope to children with heart disease. Through their efforts a consortium of like-minded organizations has been assembled to aid in the development of a foundation on which to build a pediatric cardiac program. We are the only consortium of non-profit organizations currently in Haiti performing heart surgery either on children or adults. Haitian children with heart disease currently have no other access to cardiac care except through medical missions.

Through the leadership of GOLI, tremendous progress has been made in developing a pediatric cardiac program at St. Damien Hospital. Strategies continue to be created and implemented and partnerships strengthened. Haitian healthcare professionals are showing great progress in utilizing their increased knowledge and skills to care for patients during VTT missions. The administration at St. Damien Hospital has worked to locate some local vendors and is now beginning to provide some specialized disposables and medicines for VTT missions. In the past year, a great deal of effort has been put forth by all partners in response to a strategy to improve infection control. The development of such a complex program requires many partners as well as a leader to coordinate all these efforts. GOLI takes on this leadership role and creates strategies to have partners work together to implement a step by step methodology at a pace comfortable for all concerned and appropriate to the development of the program.

In addition to the above, GOLI will secure expert medical teams to provide training to the Haitian healthcare professionals. GOLI will also work with St. Damien Hospital to track inventory as well as with all VTT teams to ensure all necessary supplies, medications and equipment needed to successfully complete each mission trip are in place and have been ordered at the best possible pricing. GOLI will coordinate with all partners the logistics for each mission as well as the availability of the Haitian medical professionals for skills transfer. GOLI will also coordinate with Haiti Cardiac Alliance to ensure the monitoring and evaluation information is collected and submitted to Rotarians in a timely manner. Lastly, GOLI will work together with Haiti Cardiac Alliance to ensure children treated receive adequate follow up care and that children on the waiting list are monitored and prioritized for treatment as soon as possible.

Haiti Cardiac Alliance (HCA) is an important partner in Haiti and will help to coordinate follow up care for children treated. They will also monitor children on the National Cardiac Waiting List to ensure they are prioritized for treatment as soon as possible, whether it be during a VTT mission or at a partner hospital outside of Haiti. HCA will also collect information for the monitoring and evaluation of this project and will forward to Rotarian partners in a timely manner.

Vocational Training Teams

Project implementation

Describe the training needs that the team will address.

With a population of 10 million, a birth rate of 3.7% of which .08% have congenital heart disease, children and families living in Haiti with heart disease face a heavy and wide-ranging burden that takes an incalculable toll on shortening life expectancy. It is estimated that upwards of 5,000 Haitian children currently have congenital heart defects. The majority of these are treatable but due to lack of medical and financial resources in Haiti, these children live in utter despair and will most certainly die without the assistance such as this grant will provide.

Visiting medical teams will continue to provide baseline training to the Haitian medical professionals who have shown great progress in utilizing and retaining knowledge and skills learned through previous VTT training missions. Each VTT team completes an assessment of the skill level of each Haitian team member at the beginning of each VTT visit. Based on that assessment, a training plan is implemented to gradually increase the knowledge of the Haitian team and the tasks that they are able to perform independently. With the knowledge that this will be the first-ever pediatric cardiac program in Haiti, it is understood that the process of training an entire team in these highly specialized procedures will take several years. Every effort is made to have the same training teams return during the VTT mission trips to allow for continuous training of the Haitian team members.

How did your team identify these needs?

A great deal of knowledge has been gained from previous VTT missions. Following each VTT, an extensive debrief meeting was conducted with both the VTT team and the Haitian team to evaluate strengths and weaknesses, skill level in each specialty, availability of supplies and medications and strategies for future training visits. Based on this knowledge gained, we were able to identify the needs for training going forward.

Describe the specific objectives of the training, including what you expect training participants to gain from the team's expertise.

Training objectives will include targeted one-on-one training for each Haitian team member in relation to their particular specialty. Training will be focused on the treatment and post-operative care of children with lower complexity heart disease. Training will be provided in both a classroom setting as well as in the operating theatre and at the bedside in the ICU. Each VTT team will assess the knowledge and skill level of their Haitian counterpart and will provide training accordingly. The expectation, based on the skill level of each Haitian team member, is to have the VTT team encourage local team members to take on the role of primary care giver with the VTT team member standing by to offer suggestions and help when needed. Training will be provided in the diagnosis, selection, surgical procedures and post-operative care of children with heart disease.

How were members of the local community involved in planning the training?

St. Damien Hospital and Haiti Cardiac Alliance work closely with VTT teams as well as with Gift of Life International to create strategies in regards to the training of the Haitian doctors and nurses. Additionally, a planning session is held at St. Damien Hospital prior to the start of each mission where all VTT and local team members are present to discuss and implement the training and treatment plan for the mission week. A debrief is held with these same team members at the close of the mission to plan for the next mission, discuss training needs, accomplishments and to learn from the cases performed during that week.

Training recipients will receive on-going training through regularly scheduled training visits. Gift of Life International and partners are committed to supporting these training recipients as efforts are made to develop a pediatric cardiac program for the children of Haiti. Additionally, partner Akron Children's Hospital will continue their mentoring program to not only help keep skills acquired up to date but to further enhance them.

The majority of supplies, medications and equipment will be purchased outside of Haiti due to limited availability and reliability. Whenever possible, budget items will be purchased in-country. There has been a great improvement in this area with St. Damien Hospital now able to provide many more medications and disposables locally.

Medications, supplies and equipment required to perform pediatric cardiac surgeries are highly specialized and in most cases, only available from select vendors. Whenever possible, a competitive bidding process is followed, however in many cases this is not possible within this specialty. We rely on vendors who have relationships with partners of this project for many years and obtain preferred pricing and optimal delivery.

Please provide an operations and maintenance plan for the equipment or materials you anticipate purchasing for this project. This plan should include who will operate and maintain the equipment and how they will be trained.

St. Damien Hospital has a biomedical engineer on staff who will help with the maintenance of any equipment purchased. Additionally, each VTT team has at least one biomed as part of their team who will arrive in advance of the team to ensure all equipment is in good working order prior to the team's arrival. The VTT biomed will also provide on-going training to the local biomed. Training for the Haitian team on the use of the probes purchased through this grant will be provided by VTT team members who regularly use these devices and are qualified to provide training to the local team. The probes will be primarily used by visiting surgeons, visiting cardiologists, visiting anesthesiologists and the local Haitian cardiologist.

Describe how community members will maintain the equipment after grant-funded activities conclude. Will replacement parts be available?

Equipment will be maintained by St. Damien Hospital in conjunction with Biomed from Akron Children's

Hospital. Replacement parts will be available through partners such as Gift of Life International , Akron Children's Hospital and Haiti Cardiac Alliance who will continue to support the program after grant-funded activities conclude.
