Mr. Frank DiMarco is currently holding the position of Chairman of Gift of Life, Inc. while also maintaining his position as a very active member of the Rotary Club of Verrazano.

Project Overview

Tell us a little about your project. What are the main objectives of the project, and who will benefit from it?

The main objective of this project is to provide 90 Kosovar children with heart disease a second chance at life. There is currently no pediatric cardiac care available to children with heart disease in Kosova. The parents of these children must search for help for their child outside their country of birth which many cannot afford. This global grant will fund 3 VTT teams to travel to Pristina, Kosova. During each VTT mission, 10 surgeries and 20 interventional catheterizations will take place, treating a total of 30 children per mission. Additionally, the VTT Team will begin to provide entry level training for the Kosovar medical team at University Clinical Center of Kosova (UCCK).

Why did you choose to partner with this organization and what will its role be?

Gift of Life International (GOLI) has a successful track record of developing sustainable pediatric cardiac programs in emerging countries around the world. Their expertise will be a tremendous asset as we begin to develop strategies for the future of pediatric cardiac care in a country where currently there is none. GOLI also has excellent, highly-skilled medical training teams who are experienced in providing mentorship to medical professionals in emerging countries as well as assessing their knowledge and skill levels. GOLI will make every effort to have consistency in training team members to allow for continuity of training.

GOLI responsibilities include:

- 1) Assemble the VTT Team for each mission trip.
- 2) Work with VTT Team members to obtain all necessary documents to be submitted to the Kosovo authorities for approval prior to each mission trip.
- 3) Work with the hospital, with local vendors and with US vendors to ensure all necessary supplies and medications are purchased at competitive rates or are donated and are delivered to UCKK prior to the start of the mission.
- 4) Coordinate with UCKK and Host Rotarians to arrange for shipment and Customs Clearance of supplies and meds for each trip.
- 5) Work with the VTT Team to create training strategies for the local team at entry level and will continue to assess the knowledge and skill level of each specialty throughout the life of the grant and adjust the training curriculum accordingly.
- 6) GOLI CEO will work with the hospital administration and Ministry of Health to begin to create strategies for the initial development of a pediatric cardiac program for the children of Kosova.
- 7) Work with the VTT Team and Rotarians to ensure all data for monitoring and evaluation of the project and the program as a whole is collected and reported.
- 8) Work with the VTT Team and hospital staff to record and maintain record of inventory purchased and used with grant funds.

University Clinical Center of Kosova (UCKK) has expressed a desire to create a pediatric cardiac program for the children of Kosova. An assessment was completed of their facility prior to the August 2019 VTT at which time it was determined that the facility met criteria to begin the development of a program. Until now, UCKK cardiologists have been able to diagnose some of the children in need of cardiac intervention but have never had the resources to provide care for them in Kosova. Through this partnership, UCKK is hopeful that, over time, the children of Kosova will be able to receive treatment in their country of birth.

UCKK responsibilities include:

- 1) Provide the facility for the 3 VTT mission trips.
- 2) Provide a list of prospective patients to be considered for treatment.
- 3) Ensure that their staff is available during each scheduled VTT to participate in the training program.
- 4) Provide all necessary narcotics and basic disposables for each mission trip.
- 5) Share the necessary data for monitoring and evaluation of the project.

Until now, their cardiologists have been able to diagnose some of the children in need of cardiac intervention but have never had the resources to provide care for them in Kosova. Through this partnership, UCKK is hopeful that, over time, the children of Kosova will be able to receive treatment in their country of birth.

Project implementation

Describe the training needs that the team will address.

With this being a brand new program and no pediatric cardiac surgeries or catheterizations currently being performed at UCCK or anywhere in Kosova, training will begin at the most elementary level for the local team. Each specialty will require an assessment of their knowledge and skills, after which a training strategy will be put into place by the VTT Team. The Kosovar team members who are less experienced will begin by observing and listening until they are ready to begin working directly with the critically ill patients. More experienced members of the local team will work side by side with VTT Team members as skills and knowledge are shared. It will be necessary to work slowly and cohesively with the local team to allow for all to achieve a similar level of knowledge and skill in the treatment of pediatric cardiac patients.

How did your team identify these needs?

During the August 2019 VTT mission which was funded by GG1981159, an assessment of the local team was initiated. It was clear that training from an entry level is needed to establish a basis for the development of a program to provide care to Kosovar children in their country of birth. The staff and administration showed a great deal of interest and enthusiasm during the August VTT mission trip. Based on the August 2019 evaluation of the program, hospital and healthcare professionals, it has been determined through strategic

meetings with all partners that there is a strong basis to move ahead with the development of a more concrete program for the future of Kosovar children with heart disease.

Describe the specific objectives of the training, including what you expect training participants to gain from the team's expertise.

As mentioned above, objectives of training will be entry level sharing of knowledge and skills to begin to provide the Kosovar team with a base to work from in the care and treatment of critically ill patients who undergo pediatric cardiac interventions. We would expect that with each VTT mission, the knowledge and skills of the local team members will be enhanced. We would expect that as each team member and each specialty shows improvement, they will be provided opportunities to practice these skills along side a VTT Team member. We would expect that they have a better understanding of basic protocols, needs for each patient based on diagnosis and treatment plan as well as entry level medication management.

How were members of the local community involved in planning the training?

Local Rotarians and the Gift of Life Kosova members have been working with UCKK for many years to find hospitals who would accept pediatric cardiac patients on their waiting list for treatment through the global network of Rotary and Gift of Life. They have been successful in helping one child at a time, yet have always hoped that someday they could find a way to develop a program in-country. The August 2019 VTT Mission Trip was the first step towards this dream. Several meetings were held with GOLI CEO, Rob Raylman during that trip and plans were made with the administration of UCKK and local Rotarians to put a strategy together to bring in VTT teams to provide much-needed training to their local team.

TRF reserves the right to cancel the grant and/or this Agreement without notice upon the failure of either or both of the Sponsors to abide by the terms set forth in this Agreement and the Terms and Conditions. Upon cancellation, TRF shall be entitled to a refund of any global grant funds, including any interest earned, that have not been expended.
7. The laws of the State of Illinois, USA, without reference to its conflicts of laws principles, shall govern all matters arising out of or relating to this Agreement, including, without limitation, its interpretation, construction, performance, and enforcement.
8.
